Mysterious Fires. From the Insurance Journal

Now and then occurs a case which rather iscounts the average notion that pure acci-ent or even incendiarism must account for dent or even incendiarism must account for most of our mysterious fires. A Boston pa-per tells us that some weeks ago, at the close of a meeting held in a church at Oaksdale, Mass., a suspended lamp fell and was broken to pieces, going out, luckily, as it fell. What "might have been" we can all easily imagine. "might have been" we cau all easily imagine. In looking into the matter, it was found that the hook by which the lamp was suspended had become so heated by the flame of the lamp as to set on fire the beam into which it was screwed. The hook passed through the plastered ceiling, and the fire was still burning after the lamp fell, but yielded gracefully to a dose of hydropathy promptly administered. Of course but for the falling of the lamp before the house had been emptied and closed up, there would have been a church burned down, and a "mysterious" cause assigned for the occurrence. Moreover, it is not to be assumed that a single

ver, it is not to be assumed that a single evening's lamp-heat was sufficient to start this fire. The more probable theory is that the process of drying and charring had been loug going on around the base of the hook, as in the case of steampipe incendiarism, everything was in pipe incendiarism, everything was in just the condition to ignite on small provocation. To be sure, this is a singular case, and possibly quite unique. And yet it leads up to a train of thought which will repay the attention of both underwriters and property owners. Too much care can not be exercised with regard to detaching wood from whatever will communicate heat and bring about the charring process, which bring about the charring process, which prepares the way for ignition and flame. That a mere hook or screw in a ceiling should set a church on fire seems an absurd proposition, but we see that the thing has been done. Let underwriters keep the les-sen in mind, and act upon its teachings.
