WHY PHIL SHERIDAN IS NOT HAPPY. New York, December 2.—The United States Cirquit Court, over which Judge Wallace presides, was crowded this morning to hear the proceedings in the suit of Janer A. Wheelan against General Sheridan, for the recovery of \$416,278,57, alleged loss sustained by him by the action of General Sheridan. Wheelan affirms that on the 8th of August, 1867, General Sheridan by force of arms seized the plantation and the property on it occupied by his family, and the same day he seized by force of arms in the city of New Orleans, 350 hogsheads of sugar and 300 tarrels of molasses, all of the value of \$57.578, belonging to the plaintiff, who alleges that Sheridan converted the proceeds to his own use. He also alleges that he has been the victim of many wrongs and injuries at the hands of General Sheridan.
