The synopsis of the President's message to Congress, published yesterday morning, was too meagre to warrant extensive comment. The full content will be recorded in a few days, and then, while presenting its main features to our readers, we shall present its meaning as it bears upon the President's attitude toward the South, and if justice has not been done in the transmission, we fear there is little to be found in that attitude of an encouraging nature for the Southern people. The President lays an unvarnished stress upon the reports of the "intelligible" of the colored voters in the Southern States, and treats of the subject in a manner to warrant the suggestion that the recent title to the White House, participated in by Zach Chandler and other of the old leading Radicals who were as strongly opposed to the "Southern policy" of the President as he is himself, and to the peace and political prosperity of the country. The President says that "the greatest wrong of the South Carolina secession, and many other Congressional districts outside of those States, the reports of the election have to be met on the condition that the rights of the colored voters have been overthrown and their participation in the elections not permitted to be either general or free; and therefore, in the face of the fact that no official investigation has been made by the general government, and that the reports of the intimidation referred to are made by disreputable candidates or those who have been punished for years by misrepresentation, concludes that "a more general enjoyment of freedom of suffrage by the colored people, and a more just and generous procedure of that freedom by the community of which they form a part, were generally anticipated than the record of the present campaign.
