Panama, December 13.—A fierce norther at Aspinwall on the 4th, cut off communication for several days, both by sea and rail. Royal mail and Pacific mail sleamers remained outside several days, the former being obliged to leave on the 9th for Engand without calling for passengers, freight or mails. It must be done by a change of the law. Make laws to regulate these things, and all must go well. You

The Execution of Moncasi.

London, January 4. A dispatch from dadrid gives some particulars of the execution there to day of Moneasi, the would-be assessin of King Alfonso. At sandown last night he was given to the brotherhood of Mercy, one of whose special duties it is to attend the sick and dying and devote themselves to the religious instruction and consolation of those condemed to execution. When this took place, and Moneasi saw that his last hope of life must be abandoned, his courage failed him, and be at once fell on his kness and besought the priest to hear his confession and prepare him for death. The priest and brothers passed the night with the condemed, and at an early hour this morning the gates of the prison wore throws morning the gates of the brotherhood, and guanded by a file of soldiers. On the way to the place of execution, a garroting chair, had been erected on a rather low scaffold in the plaza, which was lined with a military force and crowded with spectators. Ascending the scaffold, Moneasi was placed in the chair and the fatal collar of iron adjusted around his neck. The prison placed the crucifix to the pallid lips of the condemed, the executioner gave a solden turn of the lever at the back of the chair, Moneasi's head fell forward on his breast, and all was over.

Experiments with Egyptian corn have proved signally successful in various parts of the San Joaquin valley, and we perceive that Mr. Jefferson, of Healdsburg, reports that he has just harvested eighty bushels to the acre from an Egyptian corn field. He plants sixteen to eighteen inches apart, not over two grams in the hill. He gets three to six good heads, which he cures on the ground before putting away or threshing. He planted in the middle of May. The yield of Egyptian corn is usually double that of Indian corn, while the meal is essed to make delicious bread, which is generally preferred by those who have eaten it to that nade from Indian corn meal.
