Far out on the plain the course of Adrain's aqueduct is marked by a line of broken arches, and a little Arab village stands on the spot where Reguis fought his last battle, while a vast hollow on either side of the railway betrays the site of the famous circus where the "Martyrs of Carthage" died for their faith. The smooth plateau, sloping down to the sea, so thickly strewn with ruins that every step crushes some fragment of the ancient city, was once the fashionable quarter of the Punic beau monde, traversed by the Carthagenian Broadway, the Vis Coolestis, leading to the great theatre, whose circular basement is still visible beside the broken remants of the gymnasium. On the brow of the hill above still linger a few traces of the fort that defended the harbor; and below it, last and grandest of all, is the splendid reservoir whose mighty arches, overshadowing the deep, still water beneath, have all the effect of a Gothic cathedral built over a Venetian canal.
