Geological evidences have justified the conclusion that the river receives a very large portion of its water from the far north-west. The small amount of rain we have had the past year, it is reasonable to presume, is therefore not the only reason, as some suppose, which explains the falling off in the flow of water. Those who have observed, my that the river contains much more water during the summer mouths than any other meason of the year, and explain this phenomenon, if such you may call it, by the melting of snow on the Sierra Madre mountains. It is predicted that there will be no material increase in the flow of water until the warm son which June unlevs in shall melt the snow and convert it into water. It is well known that the Ric Grande is affected by them snows—not by under-ground corrents out by streams conveying the water as it media directly into the river. All the streams of western Texas are at present uncommonly tow—the unity coming of cold weather last fall, which not only stopped the melting of the snow on the Sierra Madre, but added to its atreaty boundless and unnecessitate quantity, being deemed the cause.

American Stockman.

The Stockman has heretofore called attention to the necessity which is making itself felt for adopting breeds of cattle and sheep which will give us more lean meat, tender and juicy, in place of the masses of fat heretofore considered the triumph of the breedcers' art. We have urged feeders to make their cattle fat, very fat, in order that they might bring a higher price in the market. We continue to urge them to do this, but it is not because an animal loaded with tallow inside and blanketed thickly with fat outside is more valuable as food to the consumer, but because without fat our average American cattle make poor beef, and our sheep poor mutton. There are breeds of cattle and of sheep which give a large amount of lean meat where meat is wasted, close to the back of the beast, with comparatively little fat and that evenly distributed throughout the meat in fine threads. Such breeds are what we want in the west where the production of meat is now a great industry but yet in its infancy. Butchers are finding year more difficulty in selling the fat with the lean. Of course, if they are called upon to sell the fat from the bullock for the price of tallow, they must break down the price of the cattle on foot, or, failing in that, must raise the price of their choice cuts. Any attempt to adopt the latter course brings a storm of indignation and smaller sales. The housekeeper rightly enough retures to pay for that which is of no use to him, the butcher cannot afford to pay for what he cannot sell at a profit. Appearances indicate that fat must be driven out of the field to give place to meat. We are not a tallow eating people, nor are the nations we hope to count as regular buyers of our beeves and sheep, therefore let us abandon the making of tailow and turn our attention to breeding for meat.
