

Shot in Belf-Defence-Somethi

Enturday evening, isst, the authorities of this county were apprised of the appearance of Tom Lemons, a notorious character, but particularly noted for his success as a horse-thief, in the vicinity of the Abat crossing north of the city. Romeal Schissinger, who imparted the above information, was therefore deputized by Sheriff McCall to accompany other officers to make the arrest of Lemons. In this they did not succeed, for their coveted game got away from them by dashing across the river, and though they never caught a glimpse of the follow, he nevertheless saw his pursuers and fired three shots at them. When seen by Schlessinger during the afternoon, Lemons had four other men with him. They had several head of stolen horses, and a fine buggy of the Milburn make. The buggy was stolen a few weeks ago from a gentioman by the name of Jones, residing on the Colorado, below Austin. After their ineffectual pursuit, the officers postponed further efforts until Sunday morning, when Schissinger found Lemons seated under a tree northeast of the quartermaster's dopot. Ordering him to surrender, the officer's demand was replied to by an smphatic verbal refusal and a shot from the pistol, which barely missed him. Schlessinger, being a dead shot, in defense of his own life them fired at Lemons, the ball passing through the upper portion of his heart, and killing him almost instantaneously.

A special to the Express from Boerne announces the escape from jail of the man duberson, arrested on the charge of passing counterfeit money. Culberson was ledged in the Kendall county jail on the 37th ult., having been arrested by Sheriff Hamer, of Kerr county. He regained his liberty by digging a hole through the jail walls on Sunday, almost under the very nose of the jailer, who had visited the jail to feed him only about a half hour before his escape. A posse went in pursuit of the man, but at last accounts had not recaptured him. The charge of counterfeiting was based on the passage of an advertisement resembling greenbacks, and marked as a hundred dollar note. With this, he guiled a young German hy the name of Langbein, and purchased his horse, saddle, bridle, leggins, boots, etc.
