London, April 9.—Additional advices from Cape Town about the disaster to the British convoy on the Intombe river, March 30, report to the British troops: It is thought forty wagon drivers and their followers were filled. Twenty-five Zulu corpses were found on the field of battle. It is believed many more were drowned. The Zulus had ample time to get news of the convoy as it was delayed at the ford three days by heavy rains. The ford was only four miles from Luneberg, the place to meet the convoy. Col.
