As I have before said, this is the sheep man's harvest, and when the time ogmes, you must be ready to save it, or, like all other harvest times, if not on hand and prepared, you may loose more than you save, and not know how it was done. The idea has generally gone abroad that the sheep man's life in Texas is an easy, lazy one, but this past winter has shown the lazy shephard's degree of success. Always go about a ewe with a young lamb slowly and gently Be careful not to frighten her so as to run her off from her lamb into the main herd. If so, you may not be able to find her again. Should this happen, mark this lamb so that you will know it, and when the herd is penned, catch its mother and put both into a pen by themselves. If she then refuses to own it, the her up by the fore foot until she does. Then, when you get your herd and lambs near the corral, let the ewes with young lambs drop back and pen the main herd. Then put the ewes with mabs in a separate pen. About nine 'clock, move the lambs that you let out in the morning, with their mothers, out to some good grass near by, as close as possible to good water. And right here you will have your patience thoroughly tosted, for there is nothing more aggravating than a lot of young lambs when you try to move them. The better way is, first, before opening the gate to the pen, to enter the pen and stir all lambs up (for they are the most sleepy headed things in cristence), and then open the gate and step to one side and let them go out of their own accord. The mother can take her lamb and coax it along, when you can't betheir own accord. The mother can take he as in all other avocations.

There is no part of the business that is more confining or requires closer attention than the lambing season, and you must be right there from daybreak until dark, with coat off and sleeves rolled up, with quick step and watchful eye, not only to direct but to assist. Have plenty of good assistants. It is easy here to be penny wise and dollar foolish. It is only necessary to lose six or seven lambs to pay for a good hand a month. Then, before lambing begins, have on hand plenty of assistants and supplies, so that you need have nothing to do except to attend to the harvest. them and their mothers will feed around them. If there are no cayotes or hogs to bother them, they will do as well as if horded. Then, at night, move them to a separate pen and each morning and day repeat this process. If you are having come some forty or fifty lambs, per twenty-four ewes, it would be well to put them in one bunch and hold them that way some three or four days. Here is a very important point in the management of your lambs, don't put too many young lambs together until they get ten days or two weeks old, or until they mothers and lambs get to know each other

you need have nothing to do except to attend to the harvest.

In about one hundred and forty-ave days from the first day that you began breeding your ewes, you may expect the lambs to begin dropping. Just before this, place every ewe that is going to have a lamb out into a separate herd, put a good shepherd with them, and put them on the very best feed and close to plenty of water. Try and select as nice and open prairie as possible, with as little brush or anything that a sheep or lamb can hide behind. Make here some good, large, roomy pens, and plenty of them. or lamb can hide behind. Make here some good, large, roomy pens, and plenty of them. If you have nothing better use brush, but, if possible, have a few panels of movable fence. You will find them very useful and convenient, and will be the means of saving several lambs in the course of the season. Well, then, lambing has begun. You have your ewes with lamb all in herd, or if two large, in two or more herds, as the case may be, but nothing but ewes with lambs in the herd. You have plenty of help, plenty of corrals, grass, water, &c., also a light pole, about ten feet long, with a wire or something on the end bent so as to catch a lamb by the leg and hold it. A reed fishing pole is the best thing for the business that I have ever found. Then, by the side of the pen where you have the ewes, make another pen with a gate opening from one into the other. Early in the morning, as soon as you can see plainly, go with your assistant to the pen, having eaten your breakfast before day. 
