DESTITUTE COLORED REFUGEES.

St. Louis, April 17.—A Kansas City dispetch says: "Large numbers of colored southern refugees have been landed by steamboats at Wandotte in mentical between the manner of the rescue, and dying. San Francisco, April 17.—A dispatch from Portland, Oregon, says the board of trade unanimously adopted a long memorial address to President Hayes condemning in strong terms Chinese immigration to the state. New Orleans, April 17.—The convention of colored clergymen and society directors of Louisiana to consider the exodus question of their people met at moon to day as the Free Missions Baptist church. Rev. Dr. C. H. Thompson, of the colored Episcopal church, was chosen president and addressed the conference.
