GENERAL FOREIGN INTELLIGENCE

HE LONDON TIMES' AGRICULTURAL HOROSCOPE London, May 10.-The Times' financial article this morning says: The value of money remains at about one and one-eighth money remains at about one and one-eighth per cent. Attention is being drawn to the probable effects of a continuance of the cold northerly winds upon the agricultural prospects which are already sufficiently unfavorable. Unless a change occurs soon in the temperature there can be little or no fruit and there may probably be a serious defi-ciency in the cereal crops, which means larger payments than usual to foreign grow-ers and eventually dearer money. Promi-nent among other prospective deficient yields on the continent is that of silk, the cold winds keeping back the mulberry leaves upon which the silk worms feed. The flow of silver to China and Japan will probably be increased from this cause.

THE POLITICAL SITUATION. London, May 10.—The Times' leading editorial article says the government has no intention of dissolving, parliament this year. When the present ministry ask the judgment of their constituencies on their conduct they will be ablate complete an account of the policy and its results. At present it is in process of execution alike in Europe and Asia, and its bearings cannot be fully estimated. A few months more will show what has been the real value of the Berlin treat has been the real value of the Berlin treaty and measures taken in Afghanistan. Russia, mcreover, will now know that the English government will remain unaltered for at least enough time to ensure the execution of the treaty, and she will not be tempted to evade it by hopes of our policy being altered by a change in the ministry or by an appeal to the constituencies.
