The race was the first ever held in this country between the same num-ber of eights and is important as inaugurat-ing a new feature in rowing tests.

THE VIRGINIA MISCEGENATION CASE.

Richmond, May 17.—The counsel for Mary Susan Hall, the white woman confined in the penitentiary for violating the state laws relative to the intermarriage of the white and colored races by leaving Virginia and marrying Edmund Kenney, a negro, has filed a petition in the United States district court praying for a writ of habeas corpus. It is of course expected the writ will be refused when an appeal to the circuit court will at once be taken where it will be heard by Chief Justice Waite or Judge be heard by Chief Justice Waite or Judge Bond or both. Doubt seems to exist as to tiss appellate jurisdiction of the supreme court to review the recent decision made in the Kenney case by Judge Hughes, sitting in the circuit court. There could be no doubt, it is said, under the act of 1869, if the west of habeas corrors hed been awarded. doubt, it is said, under the act of 1869, if the writ of habeas corpus had been awarded and the petitioner afterwards had been re-manded to the penitentiary, as was held by the supreme court in the Yerger case. Ju-risdiction to award the writ of habeas cor-pus in cases where parties are confined con-trary to the constitution and laws of the United States was first conferred on federal United States was first conferred on federal courts by the act passed February 5, 1867, but the following congress passed an act taking from the supreme court jurisdiction in all cases wrising under the act of 1867, and so the law has since remained. The object, therefore, in filing the petition of the woman in the district court is to seek to review the decision of Jedge Hughes by invoking the appellate jurisdiction of the circuit court. A motion for a rehearing in the Kenney case also has been entered.
