HOUSE PROCESDINGS Washington, May 21.—The house resumed consideration in the morning hour of the bill to appeal and amend the law relating to the transfer of cases from state to federal court. Mr. Weaver, of lowa, moved to amend the sixth section, by adding to it a clause directing the security of the treasury to cause to be paid out, without discrimination, standard silver coin belonging to the government, that may be in the issuancy, she same as gold coin in liquidation of all kinds of coin obligations against the government. The amendment was adopted by 125 to 75, and the section, as amended, was agreed to. Discussion continued on the bill until five o'clock, when the house adjourned.
