It is difficult to see the way out of the present dead-lock between congress and the executive. How can the army be provided for? is one of the most interacting questions connected with the struggle. Much depends upon the appropriations committee, although the democrats of that committee will doubtless act as the democratic cancus desires. Under the rules the army bill can be reported to the house for action in two ways—by the appropriations committee, which may report at any time, and by an individual member under the call of states or in the morning hour, in which case it requires a two-thirds vote to bring the bill—before the house. The appropriations committee consists of nine democrats—Messrs.
