CIVIL STRIFE AMONG THE ZULUS. London, May 30.—A telegram just received from south Africa, dated Maritzburg, May 14th, says civil war has broken out among the Zwins, and a great battle was fought on the 11th, near Spring Post, between the people of a powerful Zulu chief named Mations, and the forces of Cetawayo. The former had resolved to surrender and west on their way to the British outposts when they were attacked by Cetawayo, defeated and driven back with great slaughter, Mations escaped, but the brother of Calawayo, who had joined him, is reported killed. Cetawayo then collected all his forces and took up a strong position at the fork of the white Umoclesia river, where has a swamp in front and the highest mountains of Zululand behind. THE ERUPTION OF MT. ETNA. London, May 30.—The eruption of Mt. Etna increases in force. The quantity thrown out is less, but the return of vapor has greatly increased in density. On Wednesday night a number of brilliant balls of fire were thrown to a great height and burst aloft like rockets, emitting a flery shower. A stream of lava is flowing apparently in the direction of the town of Randazzo, but the exact line has not yet been verified. During the whole of Wednesday night reports like the rolling of artillery were heard.

Catania, May 30.—Fresh craters have opened on Mt. Etna, endangering Binnaca, Viela, Randazzo and Castiglione. Clouds of ashes overhang Pledmont, which is in almost total darkness.
