That a bill repealing all laws collecting or setting one-fourth of the revenue or taxes to support free schools shall be taken up, rules suspended requiring it to be read on three several days and acted on in both three several days and acted on in both houses, and there is to be no delay or dila-tory movements, and said bill is to be acted on as expeditiously as practicable, and shall be finally passed upon in the senate within two days from the data hereof, and within two days from the date nervot, and winnis three days in the house from the time it is reported thereto, not including Sunday, and the two days time allowed for discussion in the senate to be equally divided between the respective parties hereto, and the division of time to be made in the like division of time to be made in the house; and should the majority be defeated house; and should the majority be defeated in the effort to pass said bill, they shall have the right to prescribe that the appropriation for the payment of the interest and sinking fund, and to maintain the public free schools, shall be contained in one bill, and passed or shall be contained in one bill, and passed or defeated as such, or act upon the July interest, if they desire, in a separate bill, and combine the balance of interest and sinking fund in one bill, with school and other appropriations; but should the majority succeed in passing said bill, then the minority shall have the right to prescribe that the appropriations for the payment of the interest and sinking fund and the appropriation to support of schools shall be by separate bills, passed or defeated as such.

3. All actions upon appropriations for the

3. All actions upon appropriations for the payment of the interest on the public debt, for support of public free schools and sinking fund, shall be suspended until final action upon the bill repealing the laws to set aside and collect the one-fourth for schools.

The right of members to pair upon any questions growing out of the bills upon appropriation to pay the interest, to provide for the sinking fund, to maintain the public free schools, or to repeal the laws setting apart or collecting one-fourth of the general revenue, or the taxes, to the support of the free schools, may be exercised, but upon call of the entire house the member or members absent shall be excused by the vote of the majority or minority, after delay of one hour under eaid call, should he or they not return.
