Havana, July 7 .- The English stea Havana, July 1.—Ine English steamer from Yers Cruz brings advices from the Lity of Mexico to the 30th of June: On the 20th, part of the crew of the Mexican was steamer Libertad in the harbor of Yera Cruz, mutinied and siezed the steamer while the commander was on shore. Simultan-cously some of the officers of the Yera cruz garriaon attempted to raise a revolt at the investigation of some discontented per-sons. Nine of the rebels were killed. The staumer Libertad went to sea. The war-steamer Independia and other steamers had gone in pursuit and she will probably be
