Indignation has taken the place of indifference at any laxity or tardiness of justice, and officers of courts and juries are beginning to understand that the people will not now quietly submit to the outrages upon justice that prevailed some time ago, hence, such cases as were witnessed in the capital yesterday will be more frequent occurrences from now on until our prisons are emptied, and the courts of this state will prove the best immigration documents ever issued from the state of Texas, and will drive from our midst or hold in check almost every would-be murderer in the state. Therefore, the people say, let the good work go on.

NEUTRALITY TO CONVICTS
