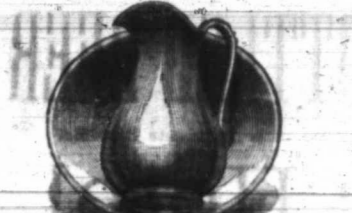

He was convicted of raping a girl thirteen years old last summer, and is expected to have committed the deed twice before, using a knife in one instance. He was defended by two promising young lawyers, appointed by the county, who appealed on the ground that the indictment should have alleged that Ake was old enough to hang. The court of appeals sustained the decision of the lower court. He appears about 27 years of age, with the usual sensuality of the negro race strongly developed in him.

PENNSYLVANIA DEMOCRATIC CONVENTION.

Principal Points in Its Platform and Nominations. Harrisburg, Pa., July 16.—The Democratic state convention has opened here today. The opera house was about half filled with delegates. Resolutions were adopted, favoring the establishment of the military to the civil authorities in all things, denying the right of the federal government to maintain an army to be used for political purposes, demanding a free ballot, according to the fraudulent nature of Hayes' election, and denouncing his abuse of the veto power as an insult and menace to the country. The financial plank favors a currency of gold and silver, and of a paper convertible into coin. The platform also opposes all subsidies and appropriation of the general government for other purposes than public service, and promises protection and support to labor, and charges the bankruptcy condition of the state is the result of the abandonment of the republican party. D. O. Barr, of Allegheny, was nominated for state treasurer by acclamation, and the convention adjourned to-day.

Accounts of the Depression of Trade in England Continue. The Cholera and Diphtheria Raging as an Epidemic in Asia. CONTINUED REPORTS OF HARD TIMES IN ENGLAND. London, July 16.—In Borealy 5,700 looms are idle out of 33,000 and 200,570 spindles out of 800,000. In the Blackburn district 11,300 looms are idle out of 22,000 and 48,000 spindles are working on short time. In the Cheshire district 1,500 looms are working on short time. Twenty other firms are running part of their machinery on short time, and several have stopped entirely. In the Bury district, both the woolen and cotton trade is depressed. The average time of working in the woolen manufacture is only 70 days a week, and 408,000 spindles and 3,720 looms are working on short time. In Stockport the prospect, especially in the weaving department, is said to be almost hopeless. It is now computed that now only 1,000,000 of spindles and 1,000,000 of looms are working in the cotton industry. One million one hundred and fifty-five thousand spindles and seven hundred and ninety looms five years ago. In Stockport, one of the cotton districts, only 100,000 spindles are working on short time. Fifty-five hundred looms there are tenanted. The Manchester Guardian gives statistics to show the extent of trade in the Roundhead district, where the machinery of the factories is adapted for Indian cotton, is even worse. Out of one hundred cotton spindles only 10 are working. Thirty-five are entirely stopped and the remainder are only running an average of three and a quarter days per week.
