THE BENNER MYSTERY.

Arrival of the Body of the Murdered Man in San Antonio.

ITS CONDITION AND THE INTERESTING ACCOUNT OF THE SEARCH AND DISCOVERY.

Great Official Excitement at New Braunfels. What Chiefly Excites the Masses to Duty.

Sheriff G. H. Schmidt, of Comal county, who undertook the task of finding the body of G. A. Benner, who on his account was searched on the 22d of last month on the road between Beaverville and Corpus Christi by his traveling companion, Corpus Christi, this city last evening on the Corpus Christi stage, which was temporarily placed under the charge of Mr. A. Dreiss. It will be conveyed to New Braunfels, the home of the deceased, and where his aged mother resides, this morning, where it will be interred. Mr. Schmidt has furnished the Express with the following full and very interesting account of his experiences and discoveries, which shows up not only the atrocity of the crime and the cold-blooded spirit which actuated the assassin, but also reveals upon several of the county officials of Nueces county, who seem to have been vitally interested in their duty to solve the mystery of the murder and bring the perpetrator to a just retribution.

Mr. Schmidt says that one of the officials, Peyton Sawyer, who was in the company of Benner at this place in former years, actually demanded pay from him for the performance of duties which it was his sworn office for the destruction of scrofulous humors. Benner had been in the county for some time, but had not been in time to conclude the investigation. The following is Mr. Schmidt's statement:

Comal County, July 20, 1879. Editors San Antonio Express: The relative position of the body of the murdered G. A. Benner, being aware that the county officials of Nueces county were doing nothing efficient towards having his mother's remains discovered, and that the fact pertaining to the same had been forwarded to the prison, I left on the 24th inst., in a special train, from New Braunfels, Texas, for San Antonio, Texas.
