The Eight-Hour Delusion

St. Louis Republican.

John McAnliff, a leading Socialist and Workingman of Chicago, who has a habit of looking at some things in a very plain, practical way, addressed his follow-workingmen recently on the subject of "What Eight Hours a Day Will Not Do for the Workingman." He told his bearers plainly that their movement, even if successful in reducing the hours of labor in Uhicago, would bring them no substantial advantage in the end. The theory that it would make an artificial scarcity of labor, and thereby increase the price of it, was a delanion. By reducing the working day in Chicago one-fifth they would increase the cost of manufacturing in that city and compel capitalists to remove their establishments to other places just as English manufacturers are removing their mills to Belgium. To make the eight-hour movement successful, he said, it must be extended not only throughout this country, but all over the world, and the Chinese persuaded to adopt it as well as our own people, because, in whatever country it is adopted exclusively, the manufacturers thereof will be placed at a disadvantage with those of other lands. And as the entire world can never be converted to the eight-hours rule, the object proposed by those who advocate it can never be accomplished. In other words, Mr. McAuliff intimated that the eight-hour partisans are throwing away their energies on a movement from which no St. Izouis Republican.
