The beavers had constructed great dams in the creek along which his party moved, and it was concluded to tear one of these dams away to use the water run. The idea was carried out, and the waters flooded the lowlands below the dam, spreading out in their course. When, however, they began to recede and flow off, it was discovered that a great many fish, some very large ones, had been left high and dry on the prairie, where they were picked up and afterwards cooked by a camp fire and caten. Of nourse a fish could no more graze on a prairie than a fowl could live in the bosom of the deep, blue sea. But the statement that fish abound on the prairies of the distant west, may be a pardonable statement, under such circumstances as the above.

Debousy's Fine Grapes.

Aiken, the Soledad street fruit man, a few days ago received a lot of grapes from Mr. O. Dobossy, the grape-grower of Texas, whose vineyard is located in the hills near Comfort, Kendall county. He would have been glad to have obtained a large quantity of the grapes, but as Bubossy had used all, excepting a few preserved for home esting, for wine, Mr. Aiken only succeeded in getting eight or ten pounds of those which had been saved. They were very large and fine, some of the bunches weighing a pound. Next year, Mr. Dobossy will raise a large quantity of grapes—sufficient to supply all the fruit stores of Texas, and in two or three years more he will be enabled to ship grapes to the great markets of the country.


