THE CHILI-PERUVIAN WAR. Particulars of the Capture by the Huas

Meeting of the Peravian Congress-

Panama, August 12.—Advises from Lima to July 30th, give the particulars of the capture of the Chilian transport Bimae by the Peruvian mea-of-war Hussear and Union off Point Monte Juya, a short distance south of Antofagasta. The Bimae was armed with four twenty-two pounders, but when overtaken by the superior speed of the Hussear and Union, she made very little resistance, firing one or two shots and then hoisting a white flag. It is regarded as a very important capture, since she had on board a cavalry regiment from the crack Chilian army corps, 215 horses, 300 Columboan rifles, with a large store of assumunition; four hundred tons of coal and a great quantity of clothing, food and munitions of war. The Rimae herself was bought by the Chilian government only four weeks ago for ten thousand pounds, and her cargo is valued at a million of soles.

Toronto, August 21.—A special asbiegram from London to the Globe says the colonial secretary has not found it advisable to recommend the guarantee for the Canadian Pacific railway extension, desired by Sir John McDonaid, but Imperial support may be given to the proposed extension in another form. Part of the scheme was laid before Sir Michael Hicks Beach, who rungested the appointment of an imperial deminissioner to act in conjunction with the Dominion commissioner, and to have charge of the lands hypothecated for the construction of the railway. The amount of money required to complete the imm to Red river is estimated at \$18,000,000. A new loan may be obtained by the Canadian government even without the imperial guarantee, but it would act as a strength to the financial scheme if the imperial commissioner should take part in the administration of the lands or revenues upon which the loan will be based.


