Several times during the last four years we have taken occasion to call attention to the new process of cotton planting so successfully pursued by Mr. J. J. Crump, of this county. The result of this process was 1,310 pounds of ginned cotton to the acre, in 1877, 1,000 pounds in 1878, and this season the prospects are good for the heaviest yield he has ever had.


