The Greek commissioners stated their instructions did not permit them to negotiate on the vigue basis thus proposed, and that it would be necessary to refer it to the Greek government. Should the Greek government not share the porte's views, it is believed the two governments would agree to refer the question to the joint mediation of the powers.


