Is the chancey court of Campbell county, Kentucky, which has been rendered by Chancellor Manly that the lottery commonly known as the Commonwealth Distribution Company of Kentucky, conducted and operated by Thomas J. Comerford, secretary, and his associates, is an illegal enterprise, subject to suppression at any moment by grand jury, and that purchasers of tickets have no security for payment of prizes.
