Richmond, Va., September 16.—The cigar makers in several factories in this city struck last week for full union wages, which were conceded by all exployers except those in one factory, who sent north, for workmen. To-day a large number of new hands arrived from Buffalo, and were met by the atrikers at the depot, who endeavored to flissmade them from going to work. The new-comers, however, went to the factory and prepared for work. The demonstration of atrikers, while not actually threatening, was of such a character as to cause the employers of the new bands to call for a detail of police at their factory to guard against violence. To-night the strikers and a large growd of sympathizers are parading the streets with music and transparences advertising factories which have acceded to the demand for wages according to the union list. No trouble is anticipated.


