THE WRONG FIG BY THE EAR

Six or seven years ago a Mexican was killed in the streets of San Antonio by a man named J. B. Hester who was indicted and convicted for the crime of murder. The verdict of the jury pronounced Hester to death, but through the influence of his counsel and friends the sentence was commuted to imprisonment for life. At least, such is the story as it is told by the people of this city.
