What He Knows About Colorado Bot the Seed,

Editors San Antonio Expans: han, of Cibolo, can furnish all the seed "Farmer" may require, or the renters of "Wm. Mitchell's place, on the Medins, Col. Play, or J. V. Dignowity, government contractor. As to the value of this grass, as hay, would refer "Farmer' to Phil Die, our booss liveryman. He used it in Austin, and asys it is equal-to timothy. Col. Peay will tell you he took some thin stock to Austin and wintered them on this bottom grass alone, and they were in good condition in the spring. Mr. Carr, of the Medina, so wed only a few acres (some two or three years back) and now his whole field is set with it. I am informed by the farmers who have raised this kind of grass, that it is not at all in the way of raising a corn crop, but comes up after the corn is laid by, and absolutely kills out the cockle bur and all other kinds of weeds growing in the corn. This I don't kills out the cockle bur and all other kinds of weeds growing in the corn. This I don't know, but I do know that when government headquarters were at Austin, contracts for bottom grams were let, and at higher rates than common prairie hay. I out this grass myself as far back as 1868. As the seed are small, like white mustard seed, three-fourths of a bushel would be planty to the acre; sow after last plowing of corn—say 10th or 12th of May, which hit the June rain and make a crop.


