Col. John W. Swisher, bell punch clerk in the comptroller's office, has issued a circular containing an argument in favor of the observance of the bell-punch law. It is an argument directed against the address made by the liquor dealer convention, at Houston, last week, in which the speakers made it their business to show that the law was not only unjust but also unenforceable.

The circular then addresses itself to the business portion of the Texas community and says that "every patron of the liquor dealer, believing in law and order, and having the welfare of the state at heart, should make it his duty to see that every drink bought by him is properly registered according to law—for it is a law and is just as valid as any law upon the statute book, and must remain so, no matter how unpopular it may be, until it is repealed, or declared unconstitutional by the courts of the country."

A tabulated statement of the number of registers, with tax collected for October, in thirteen counties is appended to the circular, which clearly shows the injustice of the operation of the law. According to this official statement, Collin county, with 112 saloons and 10,000 registers, paid a tax of \$1,000,000, while Garrettsville, with 10 saloons and 500 registers, paid only \$50,000.

There is a joint resolution before congress proposing an amendment to the constitution providing that after the 4th of March, 1880, the president and vice-president shall hold their offices for six years, and shall be ineligible for more than two consecutive terms, and that members of congress shall be elected for three years.
