The water supply question in this city is one we believe needs immediate official investigation. On account of the low pressure at present maintained, a large number of our citizens are suffering to little inconvenience. Scarcity of water is given as the reason for this state of affairs, but there are many who claim that this is not the real reason. The ditch commissioner makes demands for water which prevent the water company from giving a greater supply, and it is the question to be determined is, whether the demands of the ditch commissioner are reasonable. Many claim, and they declare they speak from actual knowledge and observation, that the ditch commissioner asks too much - more than there is necessity for, and that the ditches are kept full to the brim, there is still a waste of water at the dam below the pump house, that four inches less water in the ditches would be sufficient to meet the requirements, and is as much as was accustomed to be used. An official report on this subject would doubtless go a long way towards satisfying the people as to where the responsibility lies. We used to have plenty of water in the times when the river was much lower than at present. This point needs further explanation before the people will be satisfied with the mere dictum of the ditch commissioner.

Texas and Immigration

Immigration is the life blood of extensive, thereby adding largely undervalued state. Immigration produces a degree of prosperity of which very many people in Texas have not the slightest conception. Western states, which a few years ago were inhabited principally by Indians and other wild animals, now outrank Texas in wealth, in population in the cities, in schools, and in almost everything else that goes to make up an American civilization. Texas, if not a standard, is an average. It would be well to be reminded of this fact in our country. Texas has a hazy history which is no longer what it was in 1845. The Texas farmer, like the farmer in Minnesota and other states in the same region, is not obliged to till six months in the year. It is the first thing that is done with the intelligent wealth of the country, and the fact that the farmer, actually believing in her so thoroughly that they took turns in watching her and occasionally preventing her from taking food that they murdered her by slow starvation. To have now a series of examples of deception, willful or unconscious, the best authenticated case of living without food is that of Robert Kelley, of Harrison county, N. Y., who, under the influence of a religious proselytizer, abstained from all food except water for thirty-three days, until his death, in 1827. A paper on his case was published in the British Medical and Surgical Journal for October, 1879. Although there is not a continuous record of his case, it is a good example of what there seems to be little reason to doubt the medical and other evidence that he did abstain. He was a young student of medicine at the time, and fell under the influence of a fixed idea that he did not want to eat, and that God would not punish him for his fast.
