ADOPTED WITH AN AMENDMENT.

Paris, July 9.—The committee of the senate has adopted the amendment to the amnesty bill proposed by Gen. Peilissier, excluding incendiaries and assassins, as persons who have been condemned after due trial from the benefits of the bill.

M. Jules Simon addressed the committee after the adoption of this amendment. He said he should always be of the opinion that the amnesty imposed on the country by the contract of the principle.

He said he should always be of the opinion that the animesty imposed on the country by the action of men who had themselves been convicted, constituted a danger to public morality. The promoters of amnesty had committed a grave error, and had brought inevitable trouble upon the country. Nevertheless, for the sake of conciliation and security of the country, we have adopted the text of the bill passed by the chamber of deputies, merely adding that incendiaries and murderers condemned after trial, should be excluded from the amnesty.




