

With this antidote and spirits of Ammonia applied externally, I should have no apprehension in doing the same as Dr. Bibron did, in his experiments before the academy of sciences of Paris. He allowed a rattle-snake to bite him on the lips and cheeks, and then by taking the antidote discovered by him prevented all alarming symptons, and, in fact, suffered no inconvenience therefrom. Dr. William A. Hammond, U. S. A., and I believe now residing in Philadelphia, was stationed at Fort Riley in 1857. He made many experiments with Bibron's antidote one animals, and with complete success, which he reported in the Medice. Chigurgical Review of March, 1858. One case I will give as stated by Dr. Hammond: "Heinrich Brandt, hospital steward, was bitten on the 2ud of July 1857, on the index finger of the right hand by a large rattle-snake, which he was in the act of puts ting into a jar for preservation. The snake inflicted a very deep wound, and hung by his fangs to the finger until detached. I administered ten drops of Bibron's antidote.
