Talk With Judge Blacker About

A representative of the Trit Expuss, learning that Judge Allen Biacker, of El Paro, was in the city, called upon that gentleman at Hord's hotel. General Grierson being apprised of their purpose, established a camp at or near the locality to await the coming of the Indians. They were pursued by the Mexican soldiers under Col. Valle, and a brother of Gen. Teranas, who overtook and lought them at a point across. Valle, and a brother of Gen.
