After the reading of the death warrant, the sheriff asked him if he had anything to any. He replied: "I forgive all. I am grateful to the officers for their treatment." At five minutes of three o'clock the sheriff had pinloned his limbs and adjusted the rope and black cap. The rope holding the weight was cut, when he fell with a thad? His neck was broken, and after hanging twenty minutes he was cut down and put in a coffin. All is quiet and orderly.
