

AN ORDINANCE To enforce the construction of sidewalks, and prescribing penalty for failing or refusing to con-

Bis It Ornamed by the City Conneil of the City of San Antonio:

Sec. 1. That when sidewalks have been ordered by the City Council to be laid upon say street or plaza the owner or agents of the property fronting upon such street, or portion of such street or plaza, shall be notified thereof by the Mayor through the City Marshal or any policeman, to construct such sidewalks within thirty days after such notification in accordance with instructions to be given by the City Engineer, and if the owner of any lot or lots after notification as herein provided, shall refuse, or neglect to construct his sidewalk in conformity to directions given, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence, and upon conviction before, the Recorder shall be fined not less than five nor more than fifty dollars, and he shall be liable to prosecution at the expiration of every five days thereafter that he skill refuses or neglects to construct said sidewalk until the same be constructed.
