Richmond, Va., September 6.—During the prevalence of a heavy rain storm here last night, a whirlwind struck the lower portion of the city, unroofing several buildings, prostrating fenses and trees, and doing other damage. The whirlwind covered a radius not more than half a mile. Abother storm is prevailing to-night, secompanied by severe thunder and lightning. The weather for the past few days has been excessively hot, the thermometer during the middle hours of the day ranging from 98 to 102 degrees in the shade. Several prostrations from heat are reported, none fatal, however.

According to accounts China has learned something in military matters since the English and French iavasion in 1859 60. The Chinese military forces were then armed with bows, lances, asbrew and flint guns, and the generals were without tactics. The lessons of war they learned then were applied, and since they had the Europeans to fight they engaged Europeans to instruct them in the art and science of war. Upon Russian authority China has a standing army of 800,000 men armed mostly with the latest improvements in rifles, and many European efficers to drill them in modern treties. They have built many solid fortifications, and up to 1879 Krupp had sent to China 150 heavy guns and 275 field-guns. China has still an insignificant fleet, composed of gun-boats built in England and mostly commanded by English officers. 
