Colliery Explosion at Seaman. - An explosion in the Seaman colliery occurred at 2:30 this morning. Mr. Stratton, the resident viewer, was soon on the spot, when it was found that all three shafts of the mine were blocked, the cages being fastened to them. Stratton, with a rope around his body, proceeded to the main shaft and heard men talking, he thought about twenty. They are considered safe. The number in the pit is now stated to be 180, many having remained outside over the night, owing to the damage to the shafts by the explosion.

The Latest News From.

Washington, Sept. 8. - The latest piece of evidence of fraud in the South Carolina census discovered by republican newspapers has met with a sudden exposure.
