Washington, September 15.—The following statement, showing the condition of the cotten, corn and tobacco crop, was issued by the department of agriculture to-day:
Outon—the average condition of cotton, September 1st, is 91, showing a decline of 1 per cent. since August returns, but an in-crease over the condition reported Sopt. 1st, crease over the condition reported Sopt. lst, 1879, of 6 per cent.
