Portland, Me., September 20.—The Augusta dispatches say election returns, so far as received, give Davis a plurality of about 200 votes. There are still several towns and plantations to hear from, and there are some discrepencies in returns received by telegraph which make it difficult to ascertain the exact result of the election, and it is quite probable that only an official canvase of resums will decide who is elected.

Boston, September 20.—A special to the Herald last evening, from Portland, says the lakest returns received at democratic headquarters from 496 towns give Plaisted 73,493; Davis 78,542. "I left Maine on Friday last. Intelligence reaches me here to-day indicating that the telegraphic reports of votes as published by the associated press are in some cases modified by clerks' returns as they reach the of-fice of the secretary of state, where they are open to the inspection of the public. These medifications are of such a character as to render the contest between Davis and Plaisted extremely close, possibly requiring official returns to determine which is elected. Official returns to determine which is elected. Official returns cannot be counted or even opened until the meeting of the legislature in January. The cry of fraud is the count, &c., by Mr. Chairman Barnum if sufficiently answered by the fact that both parties in Maine have recourse to precisely the same authority for their figures, the first telegrams of the associated press and the second in the clerks' returns from the several towns. The agent of the associated press at Portland, Mr. Biephen Berry, is implicitly trusted by all parties, and is incapable of wilful misstatement or evasion. His experience in summarizing election returns is as long and as varied as any man in the country. Up to this hour there is not a particle of dispute between the parties in Maine touching returns from a single town. The only possible opportunity for frauds in election returns under our Jaws is on French plantations of Aristock, where assessors sign returns expressed in a language of which

plantations of Aristook, where assessors sign returns expressed in a language of which they are entirely unacquainted. A democratic English speaking agent who made returns has a different opportunity for misstating facts. I do not assert that returns from these plantations are fraudulent, for I do not know it, but I do assert and I know that frauds have been committed there in past years by democratic agents, and I repeat that nowhere sies in Maine is fraud practicable. The fraud of last year was not in returns stall, but consisted wholally in Gov. Gar elon and his council rejecting returns that were honestly and regularly made. Mr. Chairman Baroum is also in palpable error when he assufices that Maine has a larger territory than the other five New England states together, and the southwesternmost towns in the state are nearer to any point in the state of Delaware, mearer, indeed, to the city of Baitimore than to French plantations on the upper St. Johns by any practicable route. In this statement I speak of actual distances.
