The city council's attorneys then prepared affidavits age inst Gauthreaux and his cashier, as stated in earlier dispatches, charging them with embezzling \$33,000 city scrip and \$24,000 cash. The city owes him about \$15,000, which, with the above, will fully cover his cash deficit, leaving \$83,000 insert to be accounted for. 
