St. Paul, Minn., October 1 .- A special to the Pioneer Press says an Indian has arrived at Port Effis in full war paint with a scalp hanging to his belt, bringing the news of taux and killed nine persons. The Stonies are also following the Mandrills and more fighting is expected. The fleeing Mandrills are making their way to American territory whence they came. It is thought the Stonies and Soltaux will pursue them to this side, and it is expected the scene of war will be transferred to the United States.
