Our correspondent sets forth the claims to recognition and assistance of the people of his section, and appeals to the state or general government to assist in building some bridges in western Texas. In some states provision is made for building and maintaining "state roads" at the expense of the state, and we believe it should be made the duty of the legislature to provide for the construction of necessary bridges at least over streams on routes between large commercial towns where such bridges should be located in sparsely populated




