THE KING OF THE SOUTHERN PACIFIC IN TEXAS

Subject of Their Visit—An Interview With Mr. Crocker.

Col. T. W. Peirce, president of the Sunset road, and Mr. Charles Crocker, of the Southern Pacific, arrived at Houston tonight before coming to San Antonio.

In an interview with a reporter of the St. Louis Globe-Democrat while his party were in St. Louis, some points relative to the subject of the visit were elicited which will be of interest to our readers.

Mr. Crocker stated that the great aim was on their way to Texas to examine the line of the Galveston, Harrisburg and San Antonio road, with which the Southern Pacific will connect when finished, and in fact, to take a good look at the State of Texas and her railway system.

The contract for the line of the Southern Pacific is now being laid at an average rate of two and one-quarter miles per day, being Saturday night about twenty-four miles into New Mexico within a mile of El Paso, and 1,150 miles from San Francisco.

As fast as the rails are laid the telegraph wires in St. Louis and every day the president is advised of the exact number of feet laid. The road skirts the Rio Grande river for a long distance, and in fact follows the windings of the famous Rio Grande canyon.

When the line was first laid the surveying party toiled laboriously up the current of the rapid stream, it being necessary to use many poles to travel along the rugged bank.

At or near Fort Cummings the line of the Southern Pacific will cross that of the Atchafalaya, Texas and Santa Fe railway, now building southwesterly through New Mexico into the republic of Mexico.

In order to arrange satisfactorily certain matters of business a meeting was held in Boston, last week, of representatives of the two companies, at which it was agreed that the Atchafalaya would be extended in line south of the proposed crossing until the Southern Pacific had been extended also to that point.

It is for this reason that the line of the Pacific will be thrown eastward over the Atchafalaya until the time when the Southern Pacific will be completed to a junction with the Galveston, Harrisburg and San Antonio road.

The time when the crossing near Fort Cummings is reached by both lines will be only a few weeks, should nothing unforeseen intervene.

When completed through into Texas the business advantages of the Southern Pacific will be, as now understood, peculiarly with the Galveston, Harrisburg and San Antonio, although the former will always be in a measure the principal, by reason of its connections at various points with the Atchafalaya, Texas and Santa Fe, and other projected roads.

Both the line represented respectively by Messrs. Crocker and Peirce will build to the republic of Mexico, having in contemplation the tapping of the rich mineral sections of that country, and connecting with existing and proposed roads there.

The future of both is most brilliant, and especially that of the Southern Pacific, which passes through some of the richest mineral portions of Arizona and New Mexico, and opening up a country the right to which is just beginning to be established by the construction of roads and canals.

One leading thought in the mind of Mr. Crocker in building the Southern Pacific is the securing of the route to the markets of Mexico for the surplus products of central and southern California. At present the route is by the Colorado river, and the route of the Southern Pacific will be a shorter one, and will be a more direct one.

When the Southern Pacific was first completed to Yuma, there were run the 700 miles with only four or five changes of daily, but with its completion to Tucson, Arizona, the travel is now at once to sixty or seventy a day. Mr. Crocker had a reticent air, but he was not reticent in his talk.

He had traveled 100 miles over the route of the "hook-board" road, and when he was first seen, was making a thorough examination of the new construction. He finally climbed into the car, and after taking a critical look at the peculiar construction of the seats, plunged himself down on one of them with a yell that might have been heard in the city of Guadalupe.
