Seeking for Sunken Millions.

New York World,

A special from Lewes to the Morning News, dated Saturday, says that the International Submarine Diving company, organized two years ago by capitalists in Philadelphia to search for the Debraak, an English sloop of war which foundered in a storm off Lewes, Deleware, June 10, 1798, has discovered evidences of the missing vessel. According to papers in possession of Samuel S. McCracken, a pilot, whose grandfather was the only surviver and was engaged in piloting the vessel into harbor, about fifty-two millions of specie and jewels went down with her. The money was taken by the Debraak from an intercepted Spanish fleet while on her way to Hallfax, England, from a successful cruise on the Spanish main. With the specie 200 prisoners were taken. When the vessel foundered the prisoners were in irons on the lower deck and were all lost. Capt. Jas. Drew, who commanded the vessel and whose body was recovered two Sdays following, lies buried in St. Peter's Churchyard at Lewes. Two years after the wreck the British government sent two frigates to raise the Debraak, but without success. McCracken says that the Debraak les in fifteen fathoms of water. The divers found a large irregular ridge about fifteen feet high, eighteen feet wide and sixty feet long. On each side are piles of loose stone, supposed to be the balast thrown from the frigates in the effort to raise the wreck in 1800. Rough weather interfering with further operations, the company was compelled to postpone the search, and on Wednesday the divers returned to Philadelphia. The work, however, will be vigorously pushed forward as soon as favorable weather sets in. New York World,


