

In Chickering hall Prof. Adler discussed the Hebrew faith. He said that the central thought of orthodox Judaism was the thought of the election of Israel. The Jews regarded themselves as the banner-bearers of monotheism, as the body-guard of the Divine commander of the universe. They had no priests, their rabbis were captains of the host, their synagogue was the parade ground, where they presented several times a day to confirm their allegiance to the Lord. The teachers of judaism prescribed many hundred commandments, which were made obligatory upon their followers. The life of the medieval Jew was as hard as a garrison duty. It had the same purpose, to perfect the discipline of the soldier, and to keep him well trained in the obligations of the service. The rabbis staddled very trivial circumstances of daily life with benedictions. The purpose of these was to bring the name of God as often as possible to the remembrance of the faithful, to remind them unceasingly under whose commands they stood.

If the Jews were the chosen people of God they must hold themselves separate from the surrounding nations. This was necessary.
