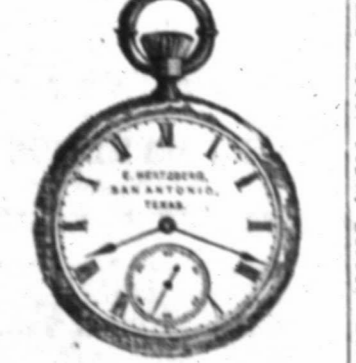

We want producers, we want men who will come to bring their wives and bags and babies, and settle down to work and say from the first day, "This is our home. We are a part of this people. Their interests are ours."

Good, industrious people, with an honest purpose of making a home for themselves, will find a hearty welcome in western Texas, no matter from what state or nation they come, no matter what their politics or religion. We got a good thing—a big thing, between here and the Gulf and the Rio Grande, and want about five hundred thousand people to share it with us.
