Despair and Determined Suicide—A Blood-Feud, Etc. Special Dispatch to the Daily Express. Houston, January 7.—A horrible accident occurred here today. James Kennedy, brother of Mrs. Whelan, of Houston, was a railroad section hand and was engaged in the building of the Morgan baggage car. The passengers were transferred, and the track will be cleared and travel resumed today.

FROM BROWNSVILLE.

French Bark Abandoned on the Beavers—Valuable Cargo—Crew Safe. Special Dispatch to the Daily Express. Brownsville, January 7.—The French bark, Long, went ashore this morning on the north breakers at Brazos, and is abandoned. The captain and crew are at Fort Isabel. She was a three-masted schooner, and had just taken a valuable cargo of woods. A French crew of about thirty men were on board. The vessel was blown to pieces by a gale.

FROM UVALDE.

Uvalde, January 7.—At eight o'clock last night, two men, representing themselves as teachers, entered the store of J. K. Stein, and demanded money. Stein refused, and the men drew pistols and fired. We are greatly told that "Mr. Hughes is determined to press his inter-state commerce bill to a vote, and determine whether congress is on the side of the people or monopolies." This is an unlikely way to state the question, but it is dangerous, nevertheless.
