The Conclusions of the Jury in the Alpena Disaster - A Floating Coma Manned by Inexpe-rienced Saline

Grand Haven. Mich. January 3.—The coroner's jury has at last returned a verdict in the case of the stramer Alpens, which was wrecked in this vicioity several weeks ago. It will be seen that the owners of the vessel are severely ceasured and held responsible for the loss of life. The verdict reads:

"We, the jury, field in the evidence before as that the several persons found know to have been passengers on board the steamer Alpena on the 16th days of Oct., 1890, came to their deaths by the foundering of the seamer Alpena while on her usual route from Grand Haven to Chicago.
