Reminder from the Veteran Subject of Mulching.

Time is short for the testing of mulching your fruit trees and planting Irish potatoes with straw. I have time and again arged putting straw around the roots of your peach trees. Last year, and even up to this time, my suggestions have not been heeded or advice taken as far as I know. As I before stated, I know this mulching to be good from experience. Already the peach trees on Flores street (some at least) are in bloom. By way of experiment, for your own good and for the good of others, let me beg of you to put straw around every other row of your peach trees, then publish the result. Right here let me or ye an article on mulching from the last weekly New York Herald:

A correspondent of the American Cultivator, dwelling ouths importance of mulching, says: "Upon a dry and rocky hillside, in the town of Shrewsburg, Massachusetts, stood an old orchard. The trees were old and had not given a good crop of apples for several years. The owner, having a large quantity of hay, drew it to the field and placed it around the trees to the depth of twelve inches, covering the whole ground occupied by the trees, omiting every alternate row. This was done in the month of July. The next year every tree where the mulch was applied was loaded with large and fair apples, while the trees themselves had made great growth of wood, and the leaves had a beautiful green and spring like appearance. 


